This past week was a vacation week for most of the schools in the area so naturally my family and I had planned a trip. The plan was to go to Nashville, TN to visit my sister who is due to have a daughter soon. It turned out we blew a gasket, a 5 hour repair. It turns out this trip did not go as originally planned, but we sure had a lot of fun anyway and found out in the end, that our vehicle was likely not up to the Nashville trip anyway.

Sometimes, life throws us curves, and they can truly be frustrating. Be if we look hard enough, it is my experience, that often times we can see God at work. For instance, although I really wanted to see my family in Nashville, and possibly a newborn niece, the car was clearly not up to the trip. What would I have done if the car broke down in some unfamiliar place where I had no connections? I think through it all God kept us from having that experience, and instead allowed us to connect with other family members. During this time we had great conversations, some of them deep spiritual ones. I am reminded of what the Bible says in Romans 8:28, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to his purpose." It is not always easy to believe that statement is it? My challenge to you is this:

If you find things in your life are just tangled up, or not working out the way you had hoped, be steadfast in prayer, and look for the blessings of God; they are there, we just need to open our eyes to see them sometimes and trust that God will work all things for the good of those who show Him how much they truly love Him. Oh, and don't forget to thank Him when you see and recognize what He has done for you.
